LPC 1073 Apologies for absence

Apologies were received from Councillors C Cartwright; S Miucci; C Price-Jones and L Trudgeon.

LPC 1077 Presentation on Allocated Employment Site – Hayle Development Plan H-E2

Mr. A. Golay currently preparing a pre-app. It is proposed to sell "serviced plots" for offices, industrial workshop and storage units. The site (adjacent to the Hayle roundabout) is a green locus for bicycles, trains, buses, although actual site access is problematic. The application will aim to offer buildings that look good. Mr Golay was invited to keep Council updated on progress and agreed to return in the Spring.

LPC 1078 Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting on Wednesday 11th December, 2019

The minutes were approved as a true and correct record of the meeting and duly signed by the Chairman.

LPC 1080 Cornwall Councillor Report – Cllr. Elliott:

- Heavy rain again resulted in multiple flood points. The drainage network is demonstrably not coping. The railway again endangered by water running onto the tracks at Gitchell Lane. Drainage pinchpoints need to be re-dug.
- CC's recent invitation for cafes/sports businesses to tender for Long Rock car park site potentially undermines adjacent businesses. Also, toilets still not working.
- Cllr. Elliott has contacted CC pointing out that Ludgvan business rates contribute approx. £4m/annum as against £50k improvements to Long Rock traffic flow. If no response by February, Parish Council to send letter.

We cover a variety of topics such as:

- ♦ The processes and terminology associated with flooding
- ♦ The hazards associated with flooding and how to carry out your role as a community volunteer in a safe way
- ♦ The role of the Emergency Services and how to collaborate with them during an incident
- ♦ How you can support your community and the Emergency Services before, during and after a flood


