After three days work and rubbish removal, the council will be in a position to review progress and decide whether or not more clearance work is needed before letting the plot. Note that all new allotment tenants are charged a £50 refundable deposit, and the council now applies a more stringent checking regime, and so similar situations in the future should be avoided. Plot 32 appears to be a special case, resulting from historical exceptions. The following recommendations will expedite the clearance of the site and the allocation of a new tenancy for Plot 32, and measures to bring it into good condition Some remaining rubbish on Plot 34 will be removed within the cost of the Plot 32 clearance works, if possible, utilising the access to a skip. Recommendations: 1. £1,500 be allocated for the cost of site clearance on the basis of 3 days work, cost of labour and waste disposal, to make the site safe, remove rubbish and scrap, to bring it to a condition ready to review next steps (costs to be drawn from Reserve funds) 2. To delegate to the Clerk, in consultation with the Chairman and Vice-Chairman and Cllrs Taylor and Trudgeon, any other works considered necessary to complete site clearance to bring it to a condition ready for letting (noting that additional costs may need to be incurred) 3. When sufficiently clear, Plot 32 to be let on the following basis: a. Rent-free until 31 December 2020 b. Tenants to be responsible for reducing all hedges to waist-height by the end of August 2020 and for clearing the site over coming months, bringing it ready to cultivate from January 2020 c.
